Fullner, Sheryl Kindle. *The Shoestring Library*. Santa Barbara: Linworth, 2010.

The Shoestring Library offers hope, incentive, and direction to librarians who lack everything but passion. The book is organized around 300 hints, more than 114 of which are green alternatives for administering a library in tough times. The book is divided into two parts: support functions and physical plant. The support section investigates such topics as the best use of volunteers and how to get free materials for your library. The physical plant section helps identify and fix problems with walls, ceilings, windows, shelving, desks, seating, and lighting, proposing low-cost or no-cost solutions to all these woes.
